Good to Know:

It's summer and we are all out and about far more often, so now is a good time to keep in mind some basic personal safety tips;

When Walking

Always be alert and aware of your surroundings and of the people around you.

Do not be easily distracted <u>Avoid being</u> on a cell phone or <u>with earbuds in your ears</u> listening to music.

Whenever possible, buddy-up when walking into dark parking lots.

Try to stay away from the brush or trees when walking.

Do not respond to conversations from strangers on the street.

Walk confidently, and at a steady pace. If going to your car, have your keys ready in your hand.

Avoid dangerous places at nighttime; visit them during day time hours.

Avoid isolated bus stops. Otherwise, continuously look all around you. Be aware.

Don't open your purse or wallet when boarding a bus; have your fare ready.

Sit as close to the bus driver as possible while on a bus during off-hours.

Be alert for pickpockets on crowded elevators, and other crowded places.

Check your purse or wallet if someone is jostling, crowding or pushing you.

Keep your wallet in your front pocket whenever possible. It is more difficult for pick pockets to remove

Keep flashy jewelry out of sight.

Do not get into an elevator if there is only one other person unless you know and feel



comfortable with that person. Take the next elevator.

Avoid danger spots like quiet or badly-lit alleyways, subways or isolated parking lots.

If you think you are being followed. As confidently as possible, cross the road, turning to see who is behind you. If you are still being followed, keep moving. Make for a busy area such as a shop, restaurant or garage, and tell people what is happening.

Walk facing oncoming traffic whenever possible. This allows you to see who is in parked or slow moving vehicles.

Be extra careful when using ATM machines. Use inside ATM's wherever possible. If possible, use only financial institution ATM's. Make sure nobody is hovering nearby and don't count your money in public.

When Driving

Keep your vehicle locked at all times, whether moving or parked.

View the interior of your car before getting in to make sure no one is hiding inside, even if the doors are locked.

Have your car keys in hand so you do not have to linger before entering your car.

What are two things you can't have for lunch? Breakfast and Dinner At night, use well-lit streets and parking lots that are open for easy observation.

Be cautious of any stranger approaching your vehicle. If you feel you are in danger, press the horn repeatedly in short blasts; this will attract attention.

If you think you are being followed, pull in to the nearest gas station or safe place. Do not drive home.

Do not pick up hitchhikers.

Don't drive right up to the bumper of the car in front of you at a red light. Leave enough room to maneuver out of your lane in case you have to get away from there. A good rule of thumb is to be able to see the back tires of the vehicle in front. Do not leave too much room allowing someone to pull in and box you in.

SECURE YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

The Van-Fraser chapter recently published the following article.

The Chapter Presidents recently attended a presentation by a Police Officer regarding the security of Personal Information, Identity Theft and Fraud.

The presentation outlined the importance of safeguarding your Personal Information and offered hints for everyone to follow.

1. Do not carry your SIN card on your person? This is a no /no, as it can easily be stolen along with your personal identiy and become a nightmare

2. Only use the Bank full official logon id(www.----) when you log on each and every time to do your on line banking.

3. Conceal your pin *#* even with an overhead protecter, when using an ATM to do your banking or drawing cash. Use an inside bank ATM where ever possible.

4. A Credit Card with a tap feature is more secure when you use the tap, as your card info is not recorded and stored on the interact reader. Also if your card is stolen the Tap feature only has a small limit on it for security. Hide your vehicle registration. Don't leave your registration in the glove box or console. If your vehicle gets stolen, thieves know your address. If possible use a company address on vehicle registrations.

Don't put your home address as the "Go Home" address for your vehicle's navigation system. Use the address of a local business. That way you can easily get going in the right direction, but a thief won't have your home address.

Always inform family or friends if you are traveling, and give them itinerary dates and locations you will visit.

and MOST IMPORTANT

Trust your gut, if it doesn't feel right, it probably isn't.



5. Do not use stand alone ATM's

6. Use a chip protector case on your credit card to prevent scanning from a thief.

7. Only use reputable companies for electronic purchases.

8. Obtain an annual Credit report to protect yourself.

9. Check your Card transactions on line frequently, don't wait till month end.

10. Change your password regularly and do not use birthdates or 1234 or any obvious numbers that might be easily guessed by a thief with lots of time.
