

VAN FRASER MEMBER SUPPORTS KIDNEY WALK

As a recipient of a Kidney Transplant in June 2010 Van-Fraser member Dennis McCann is well aware of the importance of supporting the work of the Kidney Foundation. Dennis participated in his first Kidney Walk For Life just three months after his transplant and has participated every year since.

This year Dennis raised over \$2900 adding to his total of over \$16,000 raised since 2010.

"Originally I participated in the Walk and raised donations because of how grateful I was for the new lease on life the transplant provided me" said Dennis. "After the Second Walk, I continued to raise donations for those Kidney Patients I have meet during the years who benefit from the Kidney Foundation's patient services programs and who are not as fortunate as myself in terms of economics, support networks, and ability to get a transplant. I am also emphasizing registering to be an organ donor."

Walking the full 8km distance of the Walk was a physical challenge and required some rest stops along the way. In a message to those who donated to his efforts Dennis sent this message. "I do this to make the extra physical effort to encourage your donations. It also reminds me that I am able to do so only because of my kidney transplant. Due to my ambulatory challenges, I had to take a few extra rest periods in addition to the usual layover at the site

between arriving and the start of the walk. It included 3 bench rests along the 5km route and lunch after returning to the site."

Dennis also serves on the Kidney Foundation, BC Branch, Board of Directors.

This year's Kidney Walk for Life, held June 2nd at the Athletes Village Plaza, Vancouver, raised over \$300,000 to support the activities of the BC Branch, Kidney Foundation of Canada.

The luncheon ended on a happy note with everyone wishing each other well for the summer season and looking forward to seeing them at the Fall Luncheon.


