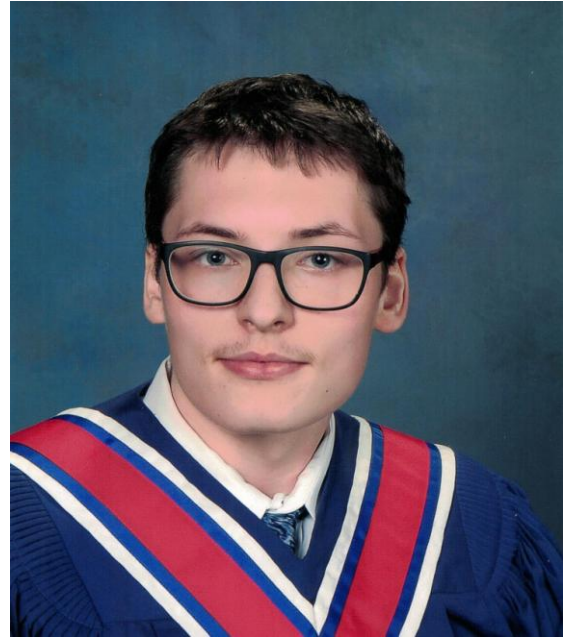
Rebecca Salehi
