The meeting took place at Asian Avenue in Vernon. Present were Gary Fisher- President, John Barrowclough-Interim Vice President, wanda Fisher- Secretary, Ed Ewanchuk- Treasurer, Fred Stoll-President of Vernon Council and Pat Rogers who joined vis Facetime from Prince George.

Ed Ewanchuk reported that we had 199 paid members. The bank balance was \$9,017.90 and we had \$202.00 in donations.

Wanda passed out copies of the Prestige Lunch menus, and three pages from the proposed Banquet package.

Wanda reviewed the agenda for the general Meeting and Banquet in September. The event is shortened considerably this year. This will cut out an extra night's accommodation for the people who are coming from a distance. As well, it was felt that a mid-day meal rather than an evening meal was easier for people so that they can return home the same day.
