HERITAGE CLUB SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2022

The Heritage Club is planning to award three (3) Scholarships to children or grandchildren of Heritage Club members who have paid dues for the past two (2) years. The Scholarships are valued at \$2,000 each for University or College studies. The Scholarships will be awarded to students starting, for the first time, their first year of full time studies.

Eligible recipients include dependent children, including adopted and step children, grandchildren and wards in legal guardianship of active members.

These Scholarships are applicable to all Canadian educational institutions which have provincial degree granting powers or their affiliates and at Canadian Colleges or CEGEP's.

To be considered, all applications must be received or postmarked on of before June 30,2022.

CANADA POST SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2022

Canada Post awards up to 30 Scholarships per year to children of full and part time employees who are entering their first year of post secondary study. The Scholarships are for \$1,000 for College and \$2,000 for University. These awards may be renewed for an additional two (2) years to cover a total of three (3) years of full study.

These Scholarships are applicable to all Canadian educational institutions or their affiliates that have provincial degree granting powers.

All submissions must be received on or by July 4, 2022.

The Chinook Chapter

Our Chapter name was derived from what the dictionary describes: "Chinook" as warm dry winds that blow down the slopes of the Rocky Mountains from the west through Calgary and Southern Alberta. These warm winds occur during the Winter months and on into early Spring, causing melting conditions in the Southern part of the province frequently. The Chinook Chapter is one of 24 Chapters across the country; we cover an area from Red Deer South and from the British Columbia to Saskatchewan borders, encompassing Calgary, Lethbridge, Medicine Hat, Red Deer and surrounding areas. We are proud, however, that these boundaries do not limit our membership. We have members of our Chapter who now live all over Canada from British Columbia to Nova Scotia. These are members who worked here in Calgary and other areas of our region but choose to remain associated with those they worked with and enjoy staying in touch.

What we do?

The Chinook Chapter organizes luncheons, subsidized Cultural events (Stage West), travel opportunities from our Van-Fraser Chapter, yearly Annual AGM and Luncheon and we hope some additional events in the future .
