

We are just wrapping up some final numbers and reports on the 2022 Santa Letter Writing campaign. This year was similar to 2021. Both individual letters and school letters were about the same as last year. For some reason we were down a bit in French letters and French school letters, but were up in other international letters, and letters in languages other than French and English.

In a very tight 3-week period, our Heritage Club chapter had 75 very dedicated volunteers that took on the task of replying to over 15 thousand individual letters and providing a class poster to nearly 800 school classes representing another 15 thousand school letters. Because of the fantastic work by our volunteers, we only had a little more than 400 letters that missed the December 22 cut-off, and all of them received an after-Christmas reply from Santa.

On a sad note, in December we were informed of the passing of Roseanne Lehr, a long time Santa's Elf. Roseanne was one of our very dedicated elves who particularly loved answering letters from school classes. December always saw Roseanne's kitchen table transformed into her own writing





workshop where she took on so many schools that we often were concerned that she was working day and night to keep up.


