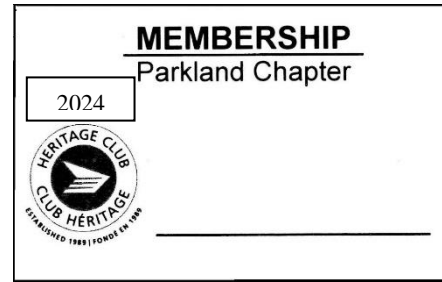
Reporting Volunteer Hours:

Donations:

Parkland Chapter, on behalf of its members, makes a number of charitable donations each year. In 2023 Parkland Chapter executive authorized cash donations to Edmonton Sports Central, The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, The Senior's Outreach Centre in Grand Prairie, and The Learning Centre Literacy Association.

In recent years we have made donations to a few different Women's shelters, some hospital foundations in northern Alberta, Ronald McDonald House, The Edmonton Food Bank, E4C School lunch program, The Mustard Seed, the Boyle Street Coop, and The Salvation Army

At the Fall Banquet members raised in excess of \$500 from the sale of tickets on raffle items, and the club contributed funds to create a \$1,000 donation. Members

voted for the charity that the evenings funds would go to and then the top 3 additional charities would be funded in 2024.

The charity with the most votes was the Edmonton Food Bank, so a \$1,000 donation was made to them in November. The other top 3 charities were The Edmonton Christmas Bureau, Make-a-Wish Foundation and Ronald MacDonald House and so for 2024, the executive has authorized donations to those charities and one additional charity to be named at a later date.

The executive would welcome suggestions from the membership on other worthy charities that they would like to see the club support.

Santa Letter Writing Program 2023

The Santa Letter Writing Program is over 40 years old, established in 1982, it is even older than the Heritage Club which started in 1989 and will be celebrating 35 years in 2024. In 1982, Santa received his own postal code HOH OHO. Thousands of postal employees and retirees answer over one million letters to Santa each year.

In Parkland, we are just wrapping up a very busy late November and December. In addition to the Santa Letter Writing Program itself, Parkland Chapter also participated in The Kingsway Santa Parade of Lights, the St Albert Salvation Army Santa's Breakfast and the Festival of Trees, Breakfast with Santa. We also had a group of members that acted as porters for the 630 CHED Santa's Anonymous Delivery Day.

We are now in the process of completing some final numbers and reports on the 2023 Santa Letter Writing campaign. Within what seemed like a very short 3-week timeframe, our Heritage Club chapter enlisted the efforts of 84 exceptionally dedicated volunteers, who assisted with providing a response to over 17 thousand individual letters and preparing and delivering class posters to over 850 school classes, representing an additional 16 thousand school letters. Thanks to the outstanding dedication of our volunteers, we only had a little over 400 letters that missed the December 22 deadline. Each of those letters received a post-Christmas response from Santa, ensuring no child was left without a reply.

What a terrific job by an incredible group of volunteers.

On December 14, 2023, we had a great turnout at the Buffet Royale Carvery restaurant in west end Edmonton, for our annual Christmas Luncheon. There was lots of visiting and catching up with friends' activities, past and future. The festive spirit was heightened when Santa made a surprise appearance, spreading cheer and delivering a small gift to all attendees.

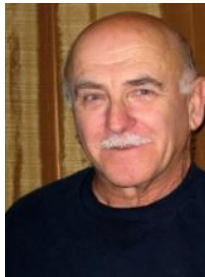

Scam of the Week: A new Spin on Call Back Phishing

Earlier this month, the FBI released an official advisory about the rise of callback phishing attacks. Callback phishing is when a phishing email directs you to call a number instead of clicking on a link. Typically, if you call the number in a callback phishing email, the cybercriminal will try to trick you into providing sensitive information. Stay safe from similar scams by following the tips below:

- Avoid calling phone numbers provided in emails. Instead, navigate to an official website to find the best contact number.
- Be suspicious of emails that contain a sense of urgency. Cybercriminals use a sense of urgency as an attempt to catch you off guard and get you to click or act impulsively.
- Consider the context, timing, grammar, and other details of the email or call. For example, would your bank usually ask you to call in?
