There are several Scholarship Programs available to the children and grandchildren of Heritage Club Members to assist them in their academic careers.

HERITAGE CLUB SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2024

The Heritage Club is planning to award three (3) scholarships to children or grandchildren of Heritage Club members who have paid dues for the past two years. The scholarships are valued at \$2,000 each for university or college studies. The scholarships will be awarded to students starting, for the first time, their first year of full-time studies.

Eligible recipients include dependent children, including adopted and stepchildren, grandchildren, and wards in legal guardianship of active members.

Your Benefits Survivor procedures:

To ensure the survivor of a retiree maintains pension, health and medical benefits, several contacts must be made after a retiree's death.

Sunlife to Canada Life health benefits transition - PSHCP- (affecting members who retired prior to Oct 1, 2000)

After a rocky start Canada Life is finally starting to catch up on a huge backlog. They have hired additional claims examiners and call takers. They claim their wait times have decreased, and claims are being processed more quickly. They have introduced a new Urgent needs escalation process for priority cases to ensure that urgent claims for life-sustaining prescription drugs, medical services and supplies are prioritized.

SCAM Alert: Here are a few of the scams that cybercriminals use on Meta / Facebook:

1. Viral Videos

Viral videos are popular on several social media platforms. If you accidentally click a link for a fake viral video, you may see a message that asks you to update your video player. However, instead of updating your video player, a virus will be downloaded onto your device.

To avoid clicking on fake video links, search Google for the video you would like to watch. If the search results don't include a link to a YouTube video or a video from another legitimate website, the viral video may be a scam.

2. Fake Profile Scam

Cybercriminals can steal names and pictures from a person's real social media profiles and send connection requests to the person's friends. Then, the cybercriminals scam the person's friends by faking an emergency. Don't fall for this trick! Be careful when you accept connection requests from someone, you're already friends with.
