#### A POSTAL SERVICE STORY

**Survivor Benefit Amount Issue this year**: Canada Post has hired a new "provider", called AON, to manage the Canada Post Pension Program. AON issued a letter containing an error THIS YEAR and they will issue a corrective letter NEXT YEAR outlining what people will be getting, correcting this misinformation on the survivor benefit amount shown on your annual personalized pension statement (PPS).

The amount reflects the value at the pension commencement date, <u>before indexation is applied</u>. Please be assured that the survivor benefit has not been reduced. If and when the survivor benefit becomes payable, the initial amount shown on your PPS from your pension commencement date will be subject to indexation in accordance with plan text provisions.

In any case, you should always keep your paperwork from your Pension in a safe place, in case you have to refer to it.

Following is the letter we received from CPC Head Office as a response to our enquiries:

#### Good afternoon,

With respect to your question about the survivor benefit amount shown on your annual personalized pension statement (PPS), the amount reflects the value at the pension commencement date, <u>before</u> indexation is applied.

Please be assured that the survivor benefit has not been reduced. If and when the survivor benefit becomes payable, the initial amount shown on your PPS from your pension commencement date will be subject to indexation in accordance with plan text provisions.


