Because of their kindness, Simcoe Chapter has been able to save some money and feel more comfortable to give to our yearly donations to various charities. Our thanks to everyone who make this possible, especially our number one supporter the superintendent of RVU at South Central Plant **Mr. Jason Langford** who has being so kind and extremely helpful to set us up for success.

I also want to thank everyone who renewed their club membership this year. We are grateful for your continued support. The Heritage Club is open to anyone and everyone who worked for Canada Post from different jobs, ranks, unions ,associations and background.
