I am incredibly grateful for all the arduous work and support she has put in and given me and our chapter for the past two years ; also grateful for her continued support to see us go through a smooth transition. I am happy to announce that Ms. Leely Chong has accepted the position of the Treasurer as of January 1, 2025.

2024 marks the 35th anniversary of the Heritage Club, a club dedicated to fostering camaraderie among retired employees of Canada Post, and living up to our motto "**people helping people**" and give back to society.
