As luck should have it, my wife and I were on the first scheduled ferry run from North Sydney to Port aux Basques after the devastation of Hurricane Fiona. When we boarded, we asked a steward for an extra pillow, and she responded with simple Down East honesty – "We got nuddin." That reply came to mind when I was thinking about this message. What could possibly be added to the conversation about the way forward from here?

But digging deeper, it's clear that while true about the pillows, that answer isn't the end of the story. The trip that led to us being on that ferry was an adventure from the start. Our journey off the island was complicated by Hurricane Earl. Then we made it back to Halifax only to be faced with Hurricane Fiona. We "experienced" the storm in a bunker-like basement apartment, where we could neither hear nor see anything. We woke to a world without electricity, internet, or cellphones. Without internet access we were completely in the dark about the ferry schedule. We were urged to stay on in Halifax until the

situation was clearer. But our reply was - We have a reservation on that boat, and the <u>only</u> way we get on it is to be on the dock when it boards.

The drive across Nova Scotia was surreal – a glorious fall day, but no gas stations, restaurants or washrooms open anywhere. The Marine Atlantic terminal in North Sydney seemed to be the only place in Cape Breton with electricity, and pulling out of the pitch dark harbor that night was really eerie. Upon reaching North Sydney we had actually been offered an earlier sailing, but any good Newfoundlander will tell you that even without the Fiona situation arriving at the dock in Port aux Basques at 1:30 a.m. is not a good scenario. So we took our scheduled crossing.

I think that's the message for today. There are very few certainties in this life. Death and taxes, of course. But even with all the uncertainties, one truth is absolute. If you're not on the dock, you don't get on the boat. Eventually you just have to come out of the bunker, hold on to your hat (put on a mask if you think it best), and take a leap of faith. There is no true life without active participation, and now that we've taken all of the precautionary steps we can, we've just got to get out there and do it. We've got to live.

Timing is everything. On December 9, 2021, the Metro Chapter held a Christmas Luncheon at the RC Legion in St. John's. There were about 70 people in attendance, and everyone thoroughly enjoyed the meal and the camaraderie. As we all know, within a few days a new variant had reared its head and we were all back in a virtual lockdown. Thankfully there were no adverse effects from our gathering, but this is the world we are living in.

In the midst of this we ran the Santa Letter Program. We had 44 volunteers who between them answered over 9000 letters. It just proves that if a project is worthwhile and the will is there, we'll make it work. Once again the campaign was a challenge, as only one person was permitted to enter the Kenmount Road plant to distribute the actual letters. At the request of the Post Office we did it, and a huge thank you goes out to everyone who made our goal of answering every child's letter achievable. This year's winner of the national incentive prize was Wayne Courish. There were also two special recognition gifts presented by Canada Post, to Tom McCarthy and Pat Burton, who between them were responsible for a truly amazing share of the letters answered.

Once again we made donations over the Christmas season to a number of charities, including The Gathering Place, the Single Parent Association of Newfoundland, Choices for Youth, the Jimmy Pratt Outreach Centre, and the Community Food Sharing Association. We also donated to the Janeway Telethon in May. The print draw held in conjunction with last year's newsletter

was a great success, resulting in a donation to the CPC Community Foundation. The winner was Fred Janes from Mount Pearl. Look for details of this year's print draw with this newsletter.

And in May of 2022, when it was deemed safe to do so, a barbeque meeting was held, again at the Legion in St. John's. Twenty-five members attended, all glad to be able to once again gather carefully and safely. A dinner meeting in October with 27 attendees, and as a result a donation of \$800 was made to the Red Cross Fiona Relief Fund which will be matched by the Federal Government. Are you ever bewildered by the challenges of finding the right contact person in a maze of government and community organizations? The 211 referral service was launched in NL in October 2020. It is a source of information and assistance which can be of particular value to seniors who are trying to access the social services available in their area. It is a free and confidential service which will connect you with a navigator who determines what the issues are, and then identifies any and all services which may be able to assist, and refers the caller to those services. This service can be invaluable to those who know they have a problem, but have no idea what resources are available to help.

♣ Your Benefits Survivor Procedures

To ensure the survivor of a retiree maintains pension, health and medical benefits, a number of contacts must be made immediately upon a retiree's death. We suggest you clip and save this page for your permanent records.

Access H.R. (1-877-807-9090)

Info required: Retiree name, employee ID #, Social Insurance number, copy of death certificate

C.P.C. Pension (1-877-480-9220)

Info required: Retiree name, employee ID#, postal code, month and date of birth, copy of death certificate, copy of retiree's will

Canada Life (1-866-716-1313)

Info required: Retiree name, employee ID#, copy of death certificate, plan number (51057 & 513910. **Note:** Very important to notify Canada Life as soon as possible in order to set up a new automatic withdrawal in the survivor's name to keep policy in force and maintain medical, dental, and vision benefits.

C.P.P. / O.A.S. (1-800-277-9914)

Info required: Retiree name, Social Insurance number, copy of death certificate. In addition to the survivor pension, there is also a death benefit payable to the survivor.

Superannuation (if applicable) (1-800-561-7930)

Info required: Retiree name, Social Insurance Number, copy of death and marriage certificates. Upon request for coverage (within 60 days of death) Sun Life premiums for survivor will be deducted directly from survivor pension.

Canada Revenue Agency (1-800-959-8281)

CRA must be contacted when a member or spouse passes away, and T-1 and T-3 to be completed.
