CANADA POST GREEN VEHICLES

As part of an ongoing commitment to reduce Canada Post's environmental footprint and move towards net zero emissions initiatives to "Green" the delivery fleet continue.

In the summer of 2021 an e-cargo trike pilot took place with two part time routes in downtown Montreal using cycling infrastructure. The trike has a maximum speed of 30 kmh and requires to driver to peddle to start the electric motor. To help go up hills there is a "turbo" setting to provide a boost. The cargo box has 2.1 cubic meters of space and can hold up to 60 parcels.

Nearly 1,500 Hybrid Vehicles have been put into service since 2019 in 200 locations across Canada.

In 2022 the Pacific Processing Centre Fleet will evaluate two electric delivery vehicles as part of a national pilot program.

The vehicle can operate for eight hours on a single charge, with a range of 175 kms and can carry 6100 lbs of load.

The vehicle will be evaluated on range, user experience, battery usage, repairs and how it handles over time.

Evaluations are also taking place in Montreal and Toronto

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

There are a number of Scholarship Programs available to the children and grandchildren of Heritage Club Members to assist them in their academic careers.

CANADA POST SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2022

Canada Post awards up to 30 scholarships per year to children of full and part time employees who are entering their first year of post secondary study. The scholarships are for \$1,000 for college and \$2,000 for university. These awards may be renewed for an additional two (2) years to cover a total of three (3) years of full time study.

Canada Post is expanding the scholarship program for 2022 to further the commitment to inclusion by offering scholarships to students with documented learning disability.

These scholarships are applicable to all Canadian educational institutions or their affiliates that have provincial degree granting powers.

All submissions must be received on or before July 4, 2022.

HERITAGE CLUB SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2022

The Heritage Club is planning to award three (3) scholarships to children or grandchildren of Heritage Club members who have paid dues for the past two years. The scholarships are valued at \$2,000 each for university or college studies. The scholarships will be awarded to student starting, for the first time, their first year of full time studies.

Eligible recipients include dependent children, including adopted and step children, grandchildren, wards in legal guardianship of active members.

These scholarships are applicable to all Canadian educational institutions which have provincial degree granting powers or their affiliates and at Canadian Colleges or CEGEPs,
