SURPLUS MATERIAL ASSISTS RAILWAY PARK

On July 2nd Van Fraser members paid an impromptu visit the Railway Museum and Park in Squamish to deliver materials for use in the park and the Railway Mail Car.

The material included over 600 pounds of discarded belting from the Processing Facility. The belting is used as a carpet in the Railway Mail Car to make it more comfortable for th visitors and reduce the wear on the floor. It was also used to provide baffles to reduce damage from inclement weather. The Railway Park Manager thanked Van Fraser and remarked, "Fred the conveyer belting is amazing! Not only will it be useful providing bellows (to improve air circulation) it will be used in the Roundhouse to protect the floor as some of the locomotives leak oil and it will protect the floor was a most timely gift".

Also donated several cartons of used Safety Vests and Hard Hats. They will be used by volunteers at the park.

A problem with impromptu visits is that sometimes no one is around. In this case the park was locked when the Van Fraser members arrived. Thankfully, a park volunteer was on site, opened the gates and helped with unloading the heavy items.

The Railway Mail Car remains one of the most popular attractions on the site with thousands of visitors passing through. The car is authentic in detail as a Cal & Van RPO including letter sortation, bag and parcel racks. It is one of a very few Railway Mail Cars remaining in Canada. It also serves as a great centerpiece for the Thomas the Tank event.

If you are looking for a place to visit in the summer check the on line schedule of the Railway Park and Museum. It provides a great look back at the Golden Age of Rail and the Mail Car in particular is a superb display of history, heritage and legacy.

MULE TRAIN MAIL DELIVERY

The hamlet of Supai is located3,000 feet below the rim of the Grand Canyon and is home to approximately 200 people of the Havasupai Tribe. Access to the hamlet is accessible with a 8 mail walk down an old footpath with a mule.



Each day a United States Postal Service employee drives 67 miles from the nearest Post Office in Peach Springs AZ and takes the mail by mule to Supai. They also bring in food and other supplies for the general store using several other mules in a "Mule Train". Lettermail delivered this way bears the unique Postmark "Mule Train"
