We received the following email from J. P. Leguerrier, President of the National Heritage Clubs.

Heather will be attending the AGM in Calgary and will keep us informed. It is important that we have your email address, if you have one as that may be the only way we can send the newsletter out in the future.

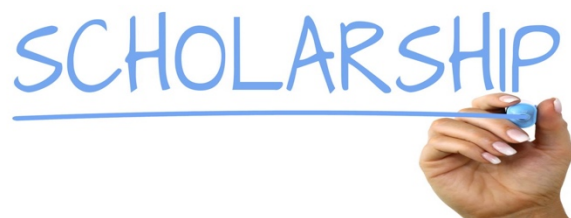
