#### **SCOA Globe Walk Challenge**

The Saskatoon Council on Aging (SCOA) Globe Walk Challenge was developed eleven years ago based on recommendations from the Age-Friendly Saskatoon Initiative team. Older adults highlighted the need for increased physical activity and social engagement, particularly during winter. In response to this community feedback, SCOA introduced the Globe Walk Challenge. Globe Walk promotes physical activity, fosters social connections, and provides a dynamic and fun way for folks to stay active and engaged during the winter.

This past winter eight members of our Heritage Club, plus four friends took part in Globe Walk. You record your steps, or your time spent with our activities such as shoveling snow, vacuuming, swimming, playing with your grandchildren or going to the gym. Then once a month you email your info to our team captain, who submits a report to SCOA.

Check us out! This year our team of 12 people stayed active and got through the winter...even our very cold February.

# And our President's Message...

Hello fellow Posties,

We are very sad to say that our 36-year relationship with Canada Post has significantly changed. Canada Post is facing both labour and financial challenges which unfortunately, has had a ripple effect on the Heritage Club. Our annual funding, as well as our mailing privileges has been cancelled, for the unforeseeable future. We don't know if this will be a permanent situation. Our club is small, and the loss of this funding will hit us hard. Our finances are in good shape, but we will be careful with what we have. Hopefully, we can work with this and that is why some of you have received the last few newsletters via email as we try to minimize our mailing costs.

Canada Post has agreed to give us one last free mailing opportunity to reach all our members with this information. We are still waiting for the arrangements for this mailing.

Some of our members are reluctant to support Canada Post since they are currently not supporting us. As a club, we are not there yet. For now, we will continue to support the Santa letters program. If you would like help to answer the letters, please let me know this November and I will pass your request on to Canada Post. (A reminder will be included in the September newsletter)

Because of the financial uncertainty, if you want to preserve this association of friends, it is now more important than ever, to pay your annual dues. It has been our mission for 36 years, to keep the camaraderie among past workers of the postal service alive.

I would also urge anyone of our paid members who has a child or grandchild to check out our annual Heritage Club Scholarship bursary program. For 2025, the amount of the scholarship is \$2,000. The deadline for aapplications is very soon, the end of June. belairdirect also has a scholarship available to any member of the Heritage Club. You don't have to be insured with them to qualify. Their scholarship deadline is July 15. The Heritage Club website at <a href="https://www.heritageclub.ca">www.heritageclub.ca</a> has additional information.

Anyone thinking of traveling should consider the discounts offered with Medoc, which will be rebranded as belairdirect travel insurance on July 1, 2025. There will be a 10% increase in the cost due to medical inflation and the value of the Canadian dollar. Everything else remains the same including the contact phone numbers. Renewal of your insurance should be done by email due to the possibility of a postal disruption. You must be a member in good standing with the Heritage Club to access the insurance.

At the AGM it was decided to drop the number of years of service to join the Heritage Club. Effective immediately the years of service required will be 20 years rather than 25 years and applies to both full-time and part-time employees.

There have been questions and concerns regarding our pensions because of the financial situation of Canada Post. Our pension will survive if Canada Post goes away. The financial position of our funds is very good. The funds are managed independently from Canada Post. There is 32 million in assets, with 65% of our assets held in Canada. The funds are internationally managed by a team of 60 people. These professionals are wisely investing to make that amount grow. The long-term position of our funds is in great shape. There is 15 to 20 years' worth of payout available. No entity can take our pension money or use the funds as collateral for a loan. Currently, Michael Butera is

the Pension Plan Chief and Investment Officer. He provided an excellent presentation at our AGM.

To end on a positive note, this year our chapter won the Camaraderie Award at the AGM, which included a cheque for \$250 for our club. This award goes to the club that shows team spirit, fellowship, collaborative culture, volunteerism, generosity, commitment to the chapter, organization, leadership and mentorship.
